

Inclusive education

Key factors

- regular schools adapt their infrastructure, methods, teaching materials and personnel policies
 to all students. It is about ensuring that all students feel at home.
- It's a springboard to an inclusive society.
- it's essential to give sufficient resources and support.
- It's about making education accessible to as many children as possible (Universal Design for Learning) / need for reasonable accommodations

The role of parents in collaboration

Key factors

- Parents are the **first and most important figure** in the lives of children
- Parents have important perspective and knowledge
- Parents are important in the decision-making process

Involvement

- Engage actively in connection
- Provide a bridge figure
- Maintain open communication
- Recognize parents' expertise

THIS child in THIS school

- Listen to anecdotes from the home context
- Set up an interaction
- Be loyal to their choice of inclusive education

Needs are central not the label

- Create a nuanced representation
- Be open to new things
- Take shared responsibility

Co creation

- Listen actively
- Give support rather than advice
- Share success
- Keep in mind that there are power relationships
