- **Lesson Plan:** Solidarity
- **Grade Level:** Secondary School
- **Time :** 55 minutes
- **Objective:** Students will understand the importance of solidarity in building a just society, and how technology can be used to promote social justice and solidarity.

Connections to the Partnership:

- This lesson aligns with the partnership's objective of promoting social justice and fostering solidarity among students. It emphasizes the use of technology tools to enhance learning and engage students in discussions about solidarity.

Overview:

- In this lesson, students will explore the concept of solidarity and its significance in creating a just society. They will analyze examples of solidarity and reflect on its impact on social justice. Students will also utilize technology tools such as Prezi, YouTube, Kahoot, and Wordwall to enhance their understanding and engage in interactive activities.

- **Specific Goals:**

- Develop an understanding of the importance of solidarity in promoting social justice.
- Reflect on examples of solidarity and their impact on individuals and communities.
- Utilize technology tools to enhance learning and engage in interactive activities.

Materials:

- Computer with internet access
- Blendspace platform account
- Word wall, Prezi, Kahoot, and YouTube accounts
- Smartboard
- Handouts on solidarity

Procedure:

Introduction (5 minutes)

1. Ask students if they have heard the term "solidarity" before and if they know what it means.
2. Encourage students to share their thoughts and ideas about what solidarity means.
3. Explain the importance of solidarity in promoting unity and cooperation among EU member states

Activities:

1. Begin the lesson by introducing the topic of solidarity and its importance in creating a just society. Use Prezi to make a presentation (<https://prezi.com/p/cobqyrak37ro/solidarity/>)
2. Share an example on YouTube (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0bbT7Vngym0>) about the recent earthquakes that happened in Turkey in April 2023, when a number of EU countries showed solidarity. Ask students' opinions and suggestions what to do when disasters happen in neighboring countries.
3. Explain that solidarity is the act of standing together as a community to support a common goal or cause. It is the idea that we are all in this together and that we must support each other to create a fair and just society.
4. Use Kahoot that allow students to test their knowledge and understanding of solidarity.

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7. Use <https://wordwall.net/resource/53115594/solidarity-wheel> to make the students talk about solidarity.

Empathy Stations

- Set up different stations in the classroom, each representing a different scenario where solidarity is needed. For example, one station could simulate a natural disaster, another could depict a bullying situation, and so on. Assign students to each station and have them role-play or discuss how they would demonstrate solidarity in those situations. Afterward, come together as a group to reflect on the experiences and discuss common themes. Find more scenarios.

Closure (10 minutes):

1. Recap the key points of the lesson and ask students to share one thing they learned about solidarity.
2. Encourage students to think about ways they can incorporate the concept of solidarity into their daily lives and activities.
3. Share a few examples of current events that demonstrate the importance of solidarity, such as protests against racial injustice or fundraising efforts for disaster relief by images.

- **Assessment:**

1. Use Liveworksheet to gauge students' understanding of the concept of solidarity.

2. Assign a short writing assignment that asks students to reflect on the role of solidarity in creating a just and equitable society.

3. Encourage students to create their own multimedia presentations or videos that showcase examples of solidarity in action.

By analyzing examples of solidarity initiatives within the EU using various ICT tools, students gained a better understanding of how solidarity can be put into practice to address common challenges and achieve common goals.
